HEELS Can cause blisters, corns, bunions and cramp. Fall over in them and risk a sprain, fracture or broken bone. Long-term use can cause posture problems and back pain.

FLIP FLOPS Any footwear which doesn't support the foot causes the toes to contract to keep the shoe on. Over time, this
